# Memorial Service for Fr. Tagawa

### Message from Deputy Principal

This month I would like to talk about the virtue of honesty.

Since even adults lie, it is understandable that children, who are more timid than adults, lie out of fear of their parents and teachers. It is common for children to pretend that they are not at fault for doing wrong, or to blame others for their actions. They may do so because of their own weakness, but when they lie, the record of their lies remains in their minds, never to be erased. No one is more unfortunate than one whose lies go undetected. Especially when the lie is shared with other peers, one cannot muster the courage to tell the truth on one's own, and one goes off the deep end, trying to convince oneself that the lie is the truth. The psychoanalyst, Sigmund Freud wrote an interesting episode in his book. There was a housewife who always tripped and fell on the sidewalk in front of a toy store. When he examined the patient, he found that the housewife had lost her child at his or her early age. He then discovers that this emotional trauma, this awareness in the unconscious, led to the housewife's fall in front of the toy store. Another book written by a French writer that I read when I was young had this to say. He said, "Human misery comes from the inability to be honest with oneself." The lie never leaves the heart of the person who tells it. Our Father in Heaven knows that we sin, but He wants us to be honest with Him. Likewise, parents would want their children to be honest at least only with them, even if they do wrong. You do not have to tell the school. I believe that simply listening to your child's confession during this summer break will help him/her follow honesty. The Ten Commandments of Moses, which were cherished by the people in the Old Testament age, include the code, "Thou shalt not bear false witness." God looks at our hearts more than the results of our deeds.

### Report Cards

The purpose of report cards is to inform households of their child's progress in all aspects of school life. The information is to be used in a positive way to help students strive for self-improvement. Grade 1 report cards are graded on a scale of 1 to 3 for all subjects. In grade 2, Math, English, Japanese, and French are on a five scale and from grade 3, Science and Social Studies are also included in the evaluation on a 5 scale. From grade 2 to 6, Music, Art, P.E. and also for grade 5 and 6, Home Economics is evaluated on a 3 scale. A 5 scale are used for core subjects in higher grade classes to provide more detailed information about students' progress. Also, you will find the enclosed physical fitness test result with the report card.

### Japanese Essay Writing Contest

As part of the morning reading and Japanese learning activities, we will hold an essay writing contest in school for all grades. The submission date for the works completed during the summer vacation is Monday, September 2. After submission, excellent works will be selected by the teachers and staff and will be given awards.

The selection of books and writing instructions were given during the Japanese class of each grade level. We also distributed some sheets of essay paper to the students. If you have any extra essay paper you purchased last year, you may use them. For details, please see the letter from the Japanese language department.

### Boys' Belts

The belt was sold for 5th grade and up. However, we have prepared one in size S for smaller kids so that it can be used from 3rd grade and up. These belts are made of leather with a buckle bearing the school emblem. (We decided not to make a rubber belt because it would be very expensive.) The sizes are S (80 cm) and M (100 cm). The price is 3,500 yen. Since there is a little trick to using the buckle, we recommend that you visit the boutique and see the actual product before purchasing.

First and second graders should continue to use suspenders as before. 3rd graders and above can also use suspenders.

#### Renewal of Commuter Passes

If you want to get a commuter pass for the first time this year or you change the station to use, you will need a proof of school commuter form prepared by us. The proof is valid for only one month, so you will need to contact our office during the summer break if you need it.
