## **♦**Message from Deputy Principal

### **♦**Change Over to Winter Uniforms

Winter uniforms will be worn from October. Be sure that students come to school with blazers, navy blue skirts or trousers, navy blue socks, and beret hats. Since the temperatures are likely to remain high in October, blazers may be worn either with or without during the month of October. Please adjust at home according to the temperature and weather conditions of the day. From Friday November 1st, all students should wear blazers to come to school.

Smocks will also be long-sleeved winter ones. Please check the buttons and the name tags. Some students are seen coming to school without hats. Please make sure they wear hats even if they come to school by car.

## **♦**Sports Day

On Saturday, October 5<sup>th</sup>, we will hold our annual Sports Day. For more details about the event, kindly check the letter that was distributed on Friday, 20th. The program will be distributed on Monday the 30th.

- The date of the rehearsal will be changed from Thursday, the 3rd to Wednesday, the 2nd.
- If the Sports Day is postponed, we will notify you via NTT Pass Mobile email. If your family has not registered for this service yet, please do the settings.
- Students will change into winter clothes on the 1st. If your child will take the school bus to and from school on that day, please get him/her to wear winter clothes to and from school. If you drive your child to and from school in your own vehicle, he/she will wear his/her PE clothes.
- White socks will be worn on the Sports Day. Please note that the color of the socks is different from that of the socks worn to school. If you have forgotten them, we will ask the students to purchase them, so please submit the allowance slip at a later date in that case.
- Please note that there will be no school bus service for parents. Parents are not allowed to use the school bus for students.
- Please confirm with your child how to leave the school. If it is different from the usual, please inform the homeroom teacher in the correspondence notebook. If you take a school bus other than the Kisarazu line, please let the bus driver know that, too.
- Please be aware of the rules and manners regarding the use of all school parking area. Please use the courtyards of the junior and senior high school and the playgrounds of the primary school as well.
- · Leisure umbrellas, tents, chairs and tables are not allowed on the artificial grass of the soccer field.
- Please note that the items used for each grade will be purchased and be paid from the allowance account. Please write your name on the items when you bring them home. Please return all the *hachimaki* bands used for cheering squads, relays, etc. to your homeroom teacher by October 15 (Tue.).

## ◆After School Study and Play

After school play will resume from October.

On Thursday, October 10 and Friday, October 11, there will be no after school study and play due to the junior and senior high school holidays. Also, due to preparations for the first entrance exam, there will be no after school study and play on Friday, October 25.

After school study and play for 1st graders will begin on Tuesday, October 8. Parents must inform their child's homeroom teacher if they wish to participate in after school study and play.

## ◆Swimming Lessons

Swimming lessons for 2nd graders will be held on Tuesday, October 15, and for 1st graders on Tuesday, October 22.

## ◆Grade 6 Graduation Trip

The grade 6 students will go on a school trip to Nagasaki for 3 days and 2 nights starting Friday, October 18.

## ◆Field Trip for 1st and 2nd Graders

We are planning a field trip in November, but only 1st and 2nd graders will go to on Wednesday, October 23, NOT on November 20, due to the closure of the facilities.

The school will be closed on Saturday, October 26 due to the first entrance examination.

#### **♦**Halloween

On Thursday, October 31, Halloween party will be held in English class for the Regular Course and in one of their classes for the International Course.

Please prepare costumes that your children can put on and take off by themselves. However, please do not bring large accessories and costumes that expose too much skin. We hope that families will make their own arrangements to prepare costumes, so as not to place a burden on your family. Photo sales will be available later from Photo Create, and 6th graders will be photographed for their graduation albums. Please make sure that they do not forget their costumes on that day. Also, no food or drink is allowed. Please do not bring snacks from home.

#### **♦**French Test

If the number of applicants for the 2024 Autumn French Proficiency Test exceeds 10, the school will be able to conduct the test in our school. The exam will be held on Sunday, November 17. Since it is a Sunday, there will be no school bus service. If your child wants to take the test, please contact the vice principal. In addition, information about the supplementary lessons just before the French proficiency test will be posted in front of the home economics room, so please attend them if a child wish to take the test.
