Tagawa says at the beginning of his message, I think we say so for the fact that we were able to spend the year safely and welcome the new year. In other words, as Fr. Tagawa says, "God has blessed us with a new year," this greeting is an expression of thanksgiving for God's grace. Especially for those who are sick in bed or in the midst of the ravages of war, the joy of being alive and the desire to celebrate the new year must be great.

Standard Achievement Tests

According to the school event calendar, NRT, standard achievement tests was scheduled to be held from February 4 (Tue.) to 7 (Fri.), but we have decided to postpone it so as to examine the result of the students' academic achievement after completing all the curriculum, and have changed the date of the program as follows:

Period: Monday, March 3 to Friday, March 7

Regular Course: 1st to 4th graders will take 2 subjects, Japanese and math. 5th and 6th graders will take 4 subjects including Science, and Social Studies.

International Course: Japanese only for all grades

Time for each subject: 40 minutes

Each exam does not affect the annual academic grade of each subject.

Please understand that if you are absent, it may not be possible to administer it at a later date due to scheduling reasons.

Results will be distributed in April of the next school year. Results for the graduating 6th graders will be mailed to their home addresses.

The test fee will be deducted from the student's account at a later date.
