◆ Plus Haut Course will be started

The Plus Haut course is set to commence in the 2025 academic year. Each year, the number of foreign children enrolled in our international programs continues to grow, reflecting a shift in the language environment. To cater to this increasingly multinational setting, we provide an elementary education program in English, using American textbooks. This program supports non-native Japanese-speaking children in learning Japanese, while helping native Japanese-speaking children enhance their English proficiency.

In contrast, the newly established Plus Haut course will deliver Japanese elementary education in both English and Japanese, utilizing Japanese textbooks. This course embodies the spirit of the school's founder, "Higher Education," by cultivating students' attitudes toward engaging with advanced learning content. Graduates of the Plus Haut course will progress to the Tokushin course at our junior and senior high school, where they will benefit from level-specific English instruction and strive to enter highly competitive universities. Students will also have the option to transition to the International course or the St. John course.

◆ Timetable for FY2025 (changed from May)

Starting in May, the Saturday schedule will be updated as follows: Students will have lunch after the 4th period and depart from school at 12:50 p.m., with the school bus leaving at 12:55 p.m. Consequently, the French session within the "Integrated Learning Time" will be reduced from 3 hours to 2 hours.

◆ Regular classes will begin on Wednesday the 9th

For second grade and above, kindly ensure students bring the following items: a lesson bag to hold subject files (to be hung on the right hook of the desk), a toolbox, and a blue case for the desk drawer. Starting today, school lunches have resumed. Some students forgot their lunch sets, so please make sure they bring them daily.

◆ School Term Calendar and April Schedule

The annual event calendar was distributed to new students today. The academic year is divided into three terms:

- First Term: Tuesday, April 8 to Saturday, July 19
- Second Term: Monday, September 1 to Saturday, December 13
- Third Term: Wednesday, January 7 to Friday, March 13 (Saturday, March 14 for 6th graders).

Please note that school dismissal times may vary on certain days, such as the class observation day and the term-end ceremony day. Any changes will be communicated through the school newsletter *Akatsuki* and via email.

Additional details regarding the parent-teacher meeting and class observation scheduled for Tuesday, April 29, as well as the school field trip on Wednesday, April 30, will be shared at a later date.

◆ Schedule of Certification Tests

Students are encouraged to take the English Proficiency Test and Kanji Proficiency Test at least once per school year. Other certification tests are available to all students, regardless of their grade or year. These tests will be conducted during regular class periods. Students who are not participating will continue with their usual lessons. Application letters will be distributed later, so please ensure the completed forms are submitted to your homeroom teacher by the deadline.

◆ Notification of Kids Mobile Phone

Please submit a notification of your child's mobile phone possession to the school via their homeroom teacher. Ensure that the school's phone number (0438-52-3851) is included and registered in the contact list. Students in grade 2 and above must renew this notification every April. Additionally, inform the school through the homeroom teacher whenever there is a change to your child's phone model or number. Please note that bringing regular smartphones to school is strictly prohibited.

♦ How to dismiss children from school

When leaving school, we will confirm your child's boarding of the school bus. Please inform the school or homeroom teacher promptly if there is a change in your child's method of leaving school.

For those using the Highway Line school bus (Kawasaki, Yokohama, Shinagawa, Urayasu, Chiba), it is also necessary to notify the driver in case of any changes, including absences. However, there is no need to contact the Kisarazu Line school bus.

Textbooks have been distributed today. Kindly note that the fees for the paid textbooks will be deducted shortly. Please ensure that the required amount is deposited into the children's allowance account.

♦ Requests received in school evaluation questionnaires
