We know that each child has been working hard during this term toward his or her own goals, and we hope that each child will make final efforts to achieve them. We hope that these experiences will give them confidence, enrich their minds, and lead to an enjoyable summer vacation with their families.

Mother Mary's Day

On Wednesday the 28th, we held Our Lady's Day ceremony in the Chapel. During the month of May, we reflect on the three mottoes and five virtues that we respect at our school. In last year's message, I spoke about the virtues of obedience and humility of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This year, I spoke about the three mottoes, "Faith, Hope, and Love". The word "believe" appears frequently in the Bible. Jesus taught, "Blessed is he who believes without seeing" and "He who believes will be saved," but it must be difficult for anyone to believe without seeing. In my sermon, I told the children about a time when Mary appeared to a 14-year-old girl named Bernadette in a place called Lourdes, France. She was told by Mary to dig in the ground, and when she did, she found a spring of water. The water from the spring has never dried up. The miracle that people who drink or bathe in the spring's water are cured of their illnesses continues to this day. Even nowadays, 160 years after the incident, pilgrims continue to visit the Lourdes. These are all people who believe without seeing. Could the children who participated in the Virgin's Feast prayer be people who believe without seeing? The children sang "Immaculate Mary," offered

bouquets of roses and prayer cards to Mother Mary, and recited the rosary prayers in English and Japanese. It will be returned to you after being blessed by the priest.



Swimming Lesson

Swimming lessons began this month and were conducted by grades 4, 5, and 6. Students were divided into four groups according to the level of swimming skills. Students were seriously engaged and having fun, and the time passed quickly.

From next month onward, we will give swimming lessons to 4th graders and below. We will distribute a letter and participation agreement when the lesson date gets closer. On the schedule date of swimming, students must not forget any items for use, a swimwear, a swimming cap, beach sandals and a towel, including participation agreement.

Tooth Brushing Competition

The 4th graders participated in the Tooth Brushing Competition, which is held every year during "Tooth and Mouth Health Week". In the competition, they learned about oral health: how to differentiate healthy gums from gums with inflammation, how to brush their teeth properly, and how to use dental floss. Kanji Kentei Proficiency Test

The Kanji Proficiency Test will be held on Friday, July 4. 60 students will take the test: 2 for Level 5, 4 for Level 6, 11 for Level 7, 7 for Level 8, 9 for Level 9, and 27 for Level 10. The outcomes will arrive at the school during the summer holidays, 35 days after the end of exam, and will be distributed in the second term. If you want to know the result during the summer holidays, please contact the school. The next test will be held on Friday, February 6 in the third term. Students who do not take the test this time will be encouraged to try next time.

After School Study and Play Ends

After school study and play for the first term will end on Friday, July 4. Dismissal time will be back to normal schedule.

School Cleaning

On Friday, July 18, during the 5th and 6th periods from 12:55 we will have our first term school general cleaning. Students can bring their own rubber gloves and towel rags. They will wear their own P.E. uniforms. Borrowing from school will not be allowed.

From Library

Book lending for the first term will end on Friday, July 4. Books cannot be checked out during the long vacation. If you have any borrowed books at home, please return them to the library by Friday, July 11.

Red and White Hats and Smocks

As a measure to prevent heat stroke, we have decided that all children must wear a red and white hat when playing outside. If they do not have one, they will not be able to play outside. (Red and white hat is also required in P.E. class.)

Smocks are provided to prevent students from soiling their uniforms during arts, crafts, calligraphy and lunch time, etc. Some children do not bring them to school, so please make sure they will bring them. They will wear them during outside play.

Water Bottle

It is time to be careful about heatstroke. Please review the rules regarding water bottles.

ODuring the summer, bringing sports drinks is allowed. (Usually, only water or tea is permitted.)

 \bigcirc Please keep the water bottle capacity around 600 ml. Bringing a second bottle during the summer is recommended. Please refrain from bringing a big water bottle.

 $\bigcirc {\rm Plastic}\ {\rm bottles}({\rm PET}\ {\rm bottles})$ are not allowed.

 $\bigcirc {\rm Students}$ can refill their bottles at the school's water coolers.

 \bigcirc Please note that tablets for salt intake and portable cooling items(handheld fans, neck coolers) are not allowed. We ask for your cooperation in ensuring that you child brings only permitted items from home.

Students Umbrella

Students that are coming to school with an umbrella on a rainy day must bring it back home on the same day. Collapsible umbrellas left at school are to be kept in the student's classroom lockers. Umbrellas that are left in the umbrella racks for a long-time span and without a name tag will be disposed of during the summer vacation.

Summer Competitions

We will soon distribute a list of summer competitions in which students may enter their works if they want to. There are also a great many other nation-wide competitions students are free to enter, which are not introduced by our school. Please be sure to bring the works to the school if they must be submitted through our school. Moreover, this year, we will display their summer projects in the primary school building in 2nd term.
